The International Maritime Organization (IMO) has announced the theme for the 2025 Seafarer Day: My Harassment-Free Ship. It has launched the "My Harassment-Free Ship" initiative to adopt a zero-tolerance approach to bullying and harassment on board, and to build a respectful and inclusive working environment at sea.

Creating a Safer Workplace for Seafarers

Research indicates that over 50% of female seafarers and a significant number of male seafarers have experienced harassment that threatens their safety, mental health, and career development. The shipping industry must take decisive action to create a safe, inclusive, and harassment-free working environment.

The initiative aims to:

- Raise awareness of harassment issues at sea
- Promote the implementation of zero-tolerance policies within the industry
- Establish safe and effective reporting and accountability mechanisms
- Provide anti-harassment resources and support for seafarers

My sister, don't worry. Don't turn so scared. You can do it! I hope you can also become captain.
