

Shanghai Singhai Training Center Successfully Completes 12-Day Pre-Embarkation Training for Junzheng Shipping's 2026 Cadet Intake



From June 22 to July 3, 2026, the pre-embarkation training for Shanghai Junzheng Shipping cadets, planned and delivered by Shanghai Singhai Training Center, was successfully concluded.
